Job Description: University Student Facilitator

Global Leaders in Action (GLA) is a summer program held in Fort Worth that brings local high school students together with students from around the world to provide a global educational experience for underserved students. This exciting program will provide cultural-based programming at Fort Worth youth community centers as well as local non-profit organizations.

Location: Fort Worth, Texas

Program Participants: Approximately 50 high school students from Fort Worth and international sister cities

Role Description: We are seeking dynamic and experienced university students to join our team leading an exciting and immersive camp for international high school students. As the University Student Facilitator, you will play a pivotal role in implementing and overseeing the educational programs, ensuring a stimulating and enriching experience for our diverse participants.

The University Student Facilitators will work with Educator Facilitators, Curriculum Leader, and Program Manager to manage small groups of Fort Worth and international students during the Global Leaders in Action program.

Responsibilities:

- Assist with educational sessions and workshops, delivering content engagingly and interactively.
- Foster a positive and inclusive learning environment that encourages active participation and collaboration among participants.
- Scheduling: Coordinate with other leaders to ensure seamless integration of curriculum into the overall program.
- Issue Resolution:
 - Address any challenges or issues related to curriculum implementation promptly and effectively.
 - Collaborate with staff, local leaders, and students to resolve conflicts and ensure a positive and supportive atmosphere.
- International Student and Cultural Engagement:
 - Foster a supportive and inclusive environment for international students, acknowledging and respecting diverse cultural backgrounds.
 - Implement effective communication strategies to bridge language and cultural gaps among students and staff.
 - Facilitate activities that promote cross-cultural understanding and collaboration.

- Problem-Solving in a Cross-Cultural Context:
 - Address challenges related to cultural differences, adapting teaching strategies and communication styles as needed.
 - Act as a mediator in cultural misunderstandings or conflicts, promoting a harmonious camp environment.

Time Commitment: Prior to the start of the program, the University Student Facilitators will be asked to commit time for meetings with the Curriculum Leader for training and program implementation. The Educator Facilitators must be available 8:00 am - 6:00 pm starting July 7, 2025 through July 21, 2025. An overnight lock in is scheduled for the night of Friday, July 18, 2025; all University Student Facilitators are required to be present throughout the duration of the lock in. Optional evening activities may be scheduled at a later date.

Stipend: The University Student Facilitator position is an unpaid internship for the length of the program. This internship experience will provide opportunities within the following key areas:

- Project management for youth programs with an emphasis on international relations and education
- Communications and public relations
- International protocol
